CINTURS PRESENTATION

CinTurs is a research centre of the University of Algarve (UAlg), financed by the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology (FCT) and evaluated by this institution as "Very Good".

CinTurs's core mission is the development and transfer of knowledge between actors of the tourism system, oriented towards the sustainability of tourist destinations and the well-being of stakeholders. To this end, CinTurs develops research in three main areas:

- Sustainable tourism and territories;
- Tourism and hospitality competitiveness and governance;
- Tourism and stakeholders' well-being.


CinTurs guides its activity by pursuing the following strategic objectives: multidisciplinary research and collaborative processes; internationalization; connection with the region and society; commitment to excellence in scientific production; and support for advanced training.

CinTurs is a well-known reference in scientific research in the field of tourism. Being a recurring presence in the Shanghai Global Ranking of Academic Subjects, the University of Algarve has stood out in Portugal in the first positions of this ranking in the field of Hospitality & Tourism Management.

CinTurs publishes an international scientific journal in the core areas of its research lines, *Journal of Tourism, Sustainability and Well-being* (JTSW), which is indexed in the Web of Science Core Collection. It also supports the edition of the international journal of *Tourism & Management Studies* (TMS) indexed in SCOPUS.

Furthermore, CinTurs seeks to align its research production with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), mainly at the level of 'decent work and economic growth' (SDG8), 'industry, innovation and infrastructure' (SDG9), 'sustainable cities and communities' (SDG11), and 'climate action' (SDG13).

CINTURS LOCATION

CinTurs is in a privileged location that allows its researchers to combine the development of collaborative research in the frontiers of knowledge in tourism, and an active social life, as it is located approximately 6 km from Faro city centre, 5 km from Faro Beach, and 3 km from Faro International Airport. Working spaces are located at UAlg (Campus de Gambelas), mainly in the Faculty of Economics (building 8). In this building, the centre's facilities (secretariat and the room for visiting researchers and doctoral students) are located on the 1st floor, rooms 2.76 and 2.75. CinTurs also disposes of three rooms to accommodate researchers, a step from UAlg's auditorium.

HOW TO BE PART OF THE CENTRE

CinTurs accepts membership applications in three categories: Integrated PhD members, Collaborator PhD members, and PhD students.

Participation of new researchers in the research centre, in any of these categories, can be requested from the Scientific Committee of CinTurs at any time.

To become or remain an Integrated PhD member, the researcher must obtain a minimum productivity level in the last civil year as defined in the document "Guidelines for Member Eligibility and Funding for R&D Activities", available on the CinTurs website.

Collaborator doctoral members must develop research in the CinTurs scientific activity areas with, at least, one integrated PhD member of the centre.

PhD students can be part of CinTurs if they have at least one supervisor belonging to the centre's Scientific Committee. These members can join the doctoral student's network to deepen their participation in the centre and they should be aligned with the centre's philosophy and strategic lines. PhD students may also have autonomous funding to develop their investigation.


